We began this new year of classical music by opening up our spaces to more people and introducing new series in an *Opening Festival*, including thrilling concerts

from new Principal Conductors for two of our Resident Orchestras: the London Philharmonic Orchestra with Edward Gardner and the Philharmonia Orchestra with Santtu-Matias Rouvali.

Our Artist Residencies spotlight

groundbreaking artists, including Manchester Collective, Patricia Kopatchinskaja with the Budapest Festival Orchestra and Aurora Orchestra, and Bryce Dessner with the BBC Concert Orchestra. Our Contemporary Edit celebrates new music with SoundState festival and the music of Claude Vivier, both featuring our Resident Orchestra the London Sinfonietta, Chineke! Orchestra continues to champion work by living composers, including Jill Jarman and James B Wilson. Following the launch of our Family Series, we present family events in Imagine Children's Festival. with more announced throughout the year. and the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain appears with Carlos Miguel Prieto.

Great pianists return to our stages, with Yuja Wang, Maurizio Pollini for an 80th birthday recital, Isata Kanneh-Mason in her debut here, Alice Sara Ott's multimedia reimagining of the piano recital, and Mitsuko Uchida both in recital and with Mahler Chamber Orchestra.

We present ambitious stand-out projects from international ensembles: Budapest Festival Orchestra fills our spaces with Stravinsky's ballet music, the Emerson String Quartet begins the complete Shostakovich string quartets, and our Resident Orchestra the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment performs the complete Beethoven piano concertos with Sir András Schiff. In a major collaboration with the Barbican, we explore Strauss' music with the Boston Symphony Orchestra. And the year ends on an epic scale with Opera North in Wagner's Parsifal.

We're delighted to be welcoming such a wonderful range of artists to our stages, and you, our audience, back to the Southbank Centre.
