A firm fixture of the festive season, Southbank Centre's *Winter Market* returns to its riverside location next month. Featuring traditional alpine-style chalets and an array of seasonal pop-up bars and restaurants; it's time to eat, drink and be merry alongside the river Thames.

Prepare to indulge in festive favourites, shop for seasonal goodies, enjoy warming drinks and even dine in private igloos overlooking the London skyline; all under a canopy of twinkling lights.

With plenty of winter pop-up bars, street food stalls, restaurants and opportunities to shop, the Winter Market will be brimming with yuletide treats. Choose from street food favourites such as gourmet cheese toasties, truffle burgers and duck wraps; winter classics like fondue, bratwurst and eggnog; dutch pancakes, mince pies and other sweet treats. To keep things warm and merry, there'll be mulled wine, hot toddies and hot chocolate on hand.

Forming part of the Southbank Centre's **Winter Festival**, the open-air **Winter Light** exhibition will return, illuminating the Southbank Centre site with playful and thought-provoking artworks during the darkest months of the year. The light-based artworks and commissions will be installed from 4 November and remain on display until January 2022. Further information on the **Winter Festival** is due to be announced soon.

Jimmy's Winter Lodge also returns to its magical riverside spot, along with more of the infamous heated snowglobes than ever before to transport you to The Alps. Cosy up in your own private glass snowglobe, indulge in their legendary cheese fondues with warming drinks such as vin chaud and hot buttered rum, or enjoy Alpine street food in the Chalet Alpine Bar, soaking up the atmosphere and magnificent views of the city.

Stroll further down the Queen's Walk in search of a winter warmer and you'll find **Beltane & Pop** serving up a selection of tasty tipples like spiced cider and boozily British hot toddies; or stick to a classic with mulled wine or festive fizz from **Grays & Feather**.

Winterella lands at **Between The Bridges** this November, offering sensational street food, Sleigh Queen Drag Brunches and an array of family fun activities. Meanwhile The Clapham Grand takes over the Spiegeltent venue, programming an array of exciting shows featuring rising stars of cabaret, drag and comedy.

Following the market's cancellation in 2020, kick start the merriment early this year as the market stalls and pop-ups will be open from 4 November - 24 December.

Opening hours: Mon - Sun 11am - 11pm (With the exception of 24 December when trade will close at 4pm)

Winter Market at the Southbank Centre will take place on a smaller scale than usual to allow for social distancing measures and ensure an enjoyable experience for all guests.
