Welcome to a concert unlike any other.

We are proud to present the Norwegian Chamber Orchestra performing *DSCH*, a concert-theatre experience that reimagines what a classical concert can be. By working with a team of collaborators from the worlds of stage direction, lighting design, set design, costume and musical arrangement, the Norwegian Chamber Orchestra transforms the concert hall experience, transcending the boundaries of classical music.

The music and musicians remain at the very centre of the performance, while exploring the limits of what musicians can achieve; kaleidoscopic visuals illuminate the performers, masks cover the players' faces and choreography demands out-of-the-ordinary movements, all the while balancing these elements so that the experience of the music emerges stronger.

The backbone of the music is 'DSCH', the musical signature of the great 20th-century composer Dmitri Shostakovich. Taken from the German spelling of the composer's name, 'Dmitri Schostakowitsch', and based on German notation, the letters translate to a four-note motif – D, E-flat, C, B natural – that is used throughout many of his works and this performance.

Shostakovich's life and music provided the Norwegian Chamber Orchestra with the musical and dramatic scope for this concert-theatre experience. At times, the visual expression is drawn solely from the character of the music, while at other times it offers a glimpse into Shostakovich's life.

New narratives are created, not to replace the traditional concert, but to enrich and offer a fresh perspective. This has long been the Norwegian Chamber Orchestra's ambition, and now they have taken a step closer towards achieving it.
