
Tyger Blue aka Tyger Gill

Iman Villaruel is a violinist and producer from London. Embracing a genreless approach, her work takes an ethereal and forward-thinking perspective. A former dancer, Villaruel seamlessly incorporates theatricality into her artistic expression, which plays an indispensable role in defining her unique identity.



Stefon Grant

Stefon Grant is a London-born, British Jamaican artist. His first camera was a borrowed DSLR but at art school in 2013 he discovered a passion for shooting on film and crafting black & white prints in the darkroom. His work mostly features friends, family and environments with which Grant has a personal connection.



Kareyni Davis

Born and raised in Brooklyn and now based in south London, film-maker Kareyni Davis is a storyteller inspired by identity and the exploration of different methods of narrative. Starting their journey aged 13, they've explored their interest in curation and programming. She now plans to continue developing her film-making.



Four Five Six Ward-Tucker

Four Five Six Ward-Tucker is a London-based photographer who specialises in shooting with analogue cameras and film. Starting out as a street photographer in 2016, Ward-Tucker's work now encompasses live music, events and studio portraiture.



Tracy L.M.

Tracy L.M. specialises in conceptual photographic portraiture. She is known for her innovative approach to capturing the raw emotions and hidden aspects of her subjects, and for her expertise in colour grading and post production. Her personal projects document her journey into self-discovery through a spiritual lens.

Sejahari Saulter-Villegas is a Blaxican multidisciplinary storyteller from Chicago who uses his artistry to investigate what it means to be, in the body he occupies. Soipan Leteyio is a Kenyan-born singer-songwriter now based in south-east London. She started singing at a very young age and essentially decided to never stop. Kes Eccleston is a photographer, artist and director, based in north-west London. His work as an artist centres on understanding memory through photography and film-making, and is a reflection of the world as Eccleston sees it.



Hannah Oliver

Hannah Oliver is a London-based film-maker, primarily working as a writer-director. Her films speak to small moments, playing with the beauty and panic of the mundane, informed by Oliver's synaesthesia and finding contrast within colour, movement, sound and speech as a means of storytelling.

Ade Balogun is a versatile creative known as OMO Craft in the directorial realm and DEMIGOSH as an artist. As co-founder and director of the design lab Sons of Craft, he showcases his passion for artistic expression. *EGUN*, his short film, featured at the 2022 Everyman Music Film Festival.



Celine Pierron

Celine Pierron is a photographer and film-maker from New York, with Caribbean and European heritage. Pierron uses photography and film to showcase the day-to-day lives of others, applying her gentle gaze to capture the essence of connection and commonality while exploring themes of race, identity, culture and healing.



Stephen Akinyemi

Stephen Akinyemi sees his photography as dancing with light; as rhyming tones like a poet does with words. The medium gives Akinyemi the opportunity to tell stories without talking, thus removing the language barrier so everyone understands. But the question remains: how do we tell a story of what really matters?



Audrey Damier

French-born Audrey Damier grew up on the outskirts of Paris and the influence of this suburban environment shows up in her photography. Another core influence is the discussion around representation. At the heart of her work is Damier's belief that it is up to us to support, promote and create the images that we want to see.

Stee Moglie is a multidisciplinary artist who uses her skills in singing, songwriting, digital art/illustration and photography to bring her creative concepts to fruition. Having toured the UK and become a regular Sofar Sounds performer, Moglie now plans to add producer and DJ to her list of tricks.



Yvonne Shelling

As a film-maker, writer, musician and multimedia artist, south London's Yvonne Shelling is engaged in work that examines love in all its forms. Shelling is an artist enthralled by the idea of making the mundane fantastical and his work draws on absurd situations he has encountered in his own life.



Charles Mensah

Paris-born, south London-based Charles Mensah is an Afropean photographer and director who has been honing his craft with black & white fashion and portrait visuals. His approach is influenced by the work of Black photographers and artists such as James Barnor, Chi Modu, Darryl Daley and Eddie Otchere, Mensah's mentor.



Khevyn BE' Ibrahim

Khevyn 'BE' Ibrahim is a film-maker and poet whose films have featured at festivals including Aesthetic and Blackstar. They are now focused on producing via their production company The Dark M8tters, with two short films out this year: *The Broken Tree* and *We've Always Been Here.*



Izzy Odelola

Izzy Odelola is a Manchester-based drummer, percussionist and ambient composer who focuses on synthesis and music for film. Their approach to composing and performing is rhythmically dominant and heavily 'feelings' based; their philosophy is to follow their musical instincts and trust the power of improvisation.


Ronke Jane Adelakun
