Mickalene Thomas's internationally touring solo show All About Love to open at major US and UK institutions

Mickalene Thomas: All About Love will be the first major international tour of this pioneering artist's work whose influences range from 19th-century painting to popular culture. Co-organised by the **Hayward Gallery**, London, and **The Broad**, Los Angeles, and in partnership with the **Barnes Foundation**, Philadelphia, **All About Love** will be shown as a series of independent presentations, with further venues to be confirmed.

Thomas's art articulates a complex and empowering vision of self while expanding on and subverting common definitions of beauty, sexuality, celebrity, and politics. The show will highlight how Thomas has redefined contemporary ideas of portraiture and subjects,

introducing new ways of seeing the female body and dissecting the complexities of Black and female identity within the Western canon.

Through her work, Thomas subverts art history to reclaim notions of love, desire, and repose. She draws on representations of intergenerational female empowerment, autobiography, memory and tenets of Black feminist theory in writing by authors and academics such as Kimberlé Crenshaw, Patricia Collins and bell hooks, whose acclaimed 2000 essay collection *All About Love* is referenced in the exhibition's title. This exhibition will explore the ways in which Thomas's work draws on relationships and collaborations centred on love, self-expression, and joy.

Artist Mickalene Thomas, says: "The opportunity to showcase and tour my work across these leading art institutions marks a key milestone in my career as an artist. Each presentation uniquely navigates through the nuances of my work while cohesively investigating notions and topics at the core of my artistic practice. I am grateful for this incredible platform staged in cultural epicentres in the US and the UK and confident about the long-lasting impact of this show on a broader audience internationally."

Rachel Thomas, Chief Curator at the Hayward Gallery, says: "The Hayward Gallery is delighted to lead the first major UK solo exhibition of pioneering artist Mickalene Thomas. The exhibition will explore how Thomas's art articulates a complex and empowering vision of womanhood while subverting common notions of beauty, sexuality, fame and more. We are excited to join forces with other leading organisations to bring the exhibition to audiences internationally, sparking new thinking and dialogue in London and beyond."

About the Hayward Gallery

The Hayward Gallery, part of the Southbank Centre, has a long history of presenting work by the world's most adventurous and innovative artists including major solo shows by both emerging and established artists and dynamic group exhibitions.
